I am writing in relation to the Finance and Public Administration Committee's scrutiny of the financial memorandum to the National Care Service (Scotland) Bill – legislation which will impact the work our members undertake every day in communities across Scotland.

We have, today, submitted our Stage 1 response to the Health, Social Care and Sport Committee but would like to highlight to the Finance and Public Administration Committee the recent work of the [Fraser of Allander Institute, funded by CCPS](#), examining the costs of the proposed National Care Service.
